Results 2017

Key Stage 2

Assessment in primary schools changed significantly in 2016 in line with the changes seen since 2014 via the New National Curriculum. A new 'expected standard' has been decided, which reflects a higher standard than in previous years (assessments in 2015 were for the old National Curriculum).

Pupils are assessed against the new National Curriculum and results are no longer reported as levels; each child receives their test results as a scaled score from 80 - 120 and teacher assessments based on the standards in the new framework. A high score is 110 or above.

Our school results are shown below, together with the National Average in brackets.

Caution has to be given to data in percentages as we have relatively small cohorts; in our key stage one and two cohorts this year, each child counts for just over 5%.
