

### The Island at the End of the Bed · Chapter 1 · The Shimmering Island Guided Reading Notes

Read the first paragraph together. Ask: Which words help you to imagine the fish pie? ('steaming', 'rose up her nose', 'super gross') Talk about the food that the children dislike eating. Read to the end of the section. Ask: Do you think Shan was right to throw away her food? Why is her father so cross? How do we know he's cross? ('bright red', shouts at her, 'angry face') Ask: Do you think he would be so cross if he knew she'd had a bad day?

Read the next two paragraphs up to her fish pie. Ask: Why can't Shan sleep? (She is worried.) Speculate on what might be worrying Shan. (Perhaps there is trouble at school, a test, or because she can't do her homework.) Ask: What do you think she should do? (Tell her father she is worried, ask for help with her homework.) Ask: Why do you think Shan finds the paperweight soothing? (It was her grandmother's, it's smooth, it's interesting to look at.)

Read up to was in the sky! Ask: What is the first clue that something magical is happening? (The paperweight begins to glow.) Clarify what a paperweight is and ask a volunteer to describe it. Ask: What do you think has happened to Shan? (Perhaps she has gone inside the paperweight.) Ask the children to look at the word 'Swoosh'. Ask: What do you think goes 'swoosh' here? (Shan, or perhaps the world around her) Agree that the word 'swoosh' also makes a 'swoosh' sound.

Read the next paragraph up to seemed to shine with light. Ask the children to find all the adjectives that describe the island. ('green', 'glittered', 'shimmered', 'soft', 'warm') Ask the children to describe what is happening to Shan. (She floats / flies above the island then gently lands.) Ask: How does Shan move in the sky? ('falling / swimming', 'half-swam / half-tumbled') Ask: What sort of setting is this? (a tropical island) What makes it seem magical? (Everything is shiny.)

Read to the end of the story. Ask the children to locate noun phrases describing the things on the island: 'tiny fish', 'lapping waves', 'silvery trees', 'soft music', 'sparkling water', 'shimmering beach', agreeing which is the adjective and which the noun in each phrase. Ask the children to create further noun phrases to describe things they'd like to see on the island, for example 'bright birds', 'leaping dolphins', 'baby turtles', 'colourful coral'.

Ask: How do you think Shan feels at the end of the story, compared to how she feels at the beginning of the story? Agree that she seems to feel happy and relaxed. Does she feel scared? (No, she seems amazed and happy.) Ask: What sort of adventure do you think Shan is going to have? Do you think it will be magical or scary? (probably magical) Do you think Shan will have help with her worries?
