<p>Science</p> <p>Plant some seeds. Look after them carefully and keep a diary to show how they grow using pictures and descriptions.</p> <p>Don't worry that you haven't got seeds. I have a plan!</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Find out about and present information about how holidays have changed over time. Find out about what holidays were like when the grown ups that you live with were your age, and if you can, also find out about holidays when your grandparents, or even great-grandparents were young.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>If you could go on holiday anywhere in the world, where would it be?</p> <p>Research the place you have chosen and create a travel guide. Remember to include details such as the natural and man-made features of the area.</p>
<p>Art</p> <p>Find out about the work of the artist Andy Goldsworthy. Choose your favourite piece of his art and write about why you like it. Then, using either natural objects from your garden, or that you gather on a walk, plan and create your own piece of art from nature.</p>	<p>DT</p> <p>Design, create and evaluate a sandwich for a picnic. Try to use at least three different ingredients. You need to test different sandwich fillings to see which ones taste good. You could even make your own bread or use what you have grown.</p>	<p>R.E.</p> <p>Find out about the parable of the Good Samaritan and think about who you consider to be your neighbour.</p> <p>Choose a creative way to retell the story. You could use your toys and film it, create an animation on the computer or something else entirely!</p>
<p>Computing</p> <p>Use the Jessie and Friends videos at https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/parents/jessie-and-friends-videos/ to learn about how to stay safe online. You can also download the storybooks for each episode. Create a guide for staying safe online that children the same age as you would be able to use.</p>	<p>P.E.</p> <p>Create your own daily work out routine and lead an exercise class for the other people in your house.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>Use items from around your house to make musical instruments. It could be the pans from the kitchen, or a guitar using a tissue box and elastic bands.</p> <p>Using your homemade instruments compose and perform a piece of music. If possible please also record it. If you want an extra challenge, perhaps you could also write some lyrics.</p>
