

Guided reading notes

Here you can find some tips to help you in your reading sessions in class.

1

Recap on the events so far. Ask: What must happen by the end of this chapter? (Banana Boy must defeat the monstrous monkey.) Read the first two paragraphs. Reread: He was the superhero, so he did the saving. Ask: Why are the words He written in that way? (italics for emphasis) Model reading them with emphasis.

2

Read to the break. Ask: Why doesn't Banana Boy think that Pink Unicorn can help? (because he is the superhero; because superheroes don't need help; because he doesn't think that girls in pink unicorn costumes can help) Ask: Is he right? Do superheroes need help? Can girls be strong?

3

What do you think Pink Unicorn means by "You're making it stronger"? Ask: How can the bananas make it stronger? (perhaps they are feeding it) Read to the break. Together, find all the verbs in this section: gobbled, punched, bashed, roared, groaned, gasped, flew. Ask: What else does split mean here?

4

Reread: "Cool!" said Banana Boy. Ask: How are Banana Boy's feelings about Pink Unicorn changing? (Agree that first he realises she talks sense, then he sees she can fly. He is beginning to respect her.) Together, think of other powers Pink Unicorn might have. (shower sparkles, making everyone happy and so on)

5

Read to the break. What other magical powers does Pink Unicorn have? (She can create sparkling rain.) Ask a volunteer to sequence the events that lead to the defeat of the monstrous monkey. Write the key words: rainbow, rain, dolphin, spider, baboon, Mr Fluffy. Ask: Who is Millie? (Ben's sister)

6

Read to the end. What is the joke? (Millie doesn't realise that Banana Boy is her brother.) Ask: Did you like the ending? Would you like to read more stories about Banana Boy and Pink Unicorn? Who could they fight next? Who else will turn out to be a superhero? (Mum perhaps)


