The Longest Night · Chapter 2 · We're Not Alone Guided Reading Notes



Recap on the events of Chapter 1.

Ask: Why are Christian and Alfie in the woods? (Christian is camping for a dare; Alfie has come to check on him) Ask: What did Bolts say lived in the wood? (a bear) Ask: Do you think there really is a bear or is Bolts just being mean? Challenge the children to remember the spooky story that Bolts told. (After a bear went missing from the zoo, a local man went missing

and only his hat was found.)

Read the first section up to, "They can't have got that far." Ask: Why is Christian banging the pegs in hard? (To stop Bolts pulling his tent down again.) Ask: How do we know that Alfie is a good friend? Work together to list the ways: he has come to check on Christian, he notices and cares that Christian is quiet and he helps Christian with the tent.) Ask: What does the phrase cheap trick in the first paragraph mean? (A simple, silly trick.)

Ask: Why is Christian so cross? (He has been mocked and bullied by Bolts and his friends.) Ask: Why did Cathryn make chicken noises? (To suggest that Christian is frightened.) What are Alfie's two suggestions as to what he should do? (First, ignore them; secondly, take revenge.) Discuss with the group which option they think is better. Ask: What could go wrong? For example they could get lost in the wood, they could escalate the feud with Bolts, they become the bullies themselves.

Read the next section, up to back into a standing position. Challenge the children to find the phrases that make the wood sound scary at night, for example: It was so dark now that they could hardly see, The trees towered above them, the river was louder than ever. Ask: How does the reader know that Alfie is frightened? Locate the phrase a quiver in his voice. Ask: How else is Alfie having a bad time? (He gets out of breath; he falls over.)

Read the next section up to *Christian* grabbed Alfie's arm. Agree that everything is getting a bit scary now: first the forest gets darker and then it gets quieter. Ask the children to imagine how they would feel in the dark, quiet wood. Ask: Why are they whispering? (Because they are scared.) Ask: Why is Christian not scared of the rustling noises? (He's used to animals making strange noises at his dad's zoo.) Find the references to noises in this section, from rustling sounds to quite a big rabbit to a deep rumbling sound.

Finish reading the chapter, then revisit previous predictions about the bear. List the descriptions of the bear: dark brown, lumbering, taller than a fully-grown man, a thousand sharp teeth, galloping. Ask a volunteer to read the chase section, making it sound as dramatic as possible. Draw a story mountain and agree that not being able to open the locked door is probably at the top of the mountain. Speculate on who the man might be and why the bear sits down when it sees him.

In pairs or a small group, choose which option you would like to see take place in the next chapter. Present your reasons to the rest of your class. Then, as a whole class, debate each option and try to reach a final vote.

Discuss the characters you have met so far in the story. Which characters seem strong and which appear weak at this point? If someone is strong does it mean they are always good or could they be dangerous?

Use this discussion and debate to talk about different kinds of bullying - emotional, physical and online. Discuss the impact of bullying and where to seek help.
