



Guided reading notes

Here you can find some tips to help you in your reading sessions in class.

1

Read the first section. Why does Dev say he is Rocky? (to protect Rocky; to be brave; to confuse Mr Gold) Why does Rocky agree to give the diamond to Mr Gold? (to save his grandmother) Which word tells you that Mr Gold is delighted? (gleefully) Which word tell you that he is cross? (roared)

2

Find verbs that create the action of the flour throwing. (grabbed, flung, snatched, pelted) Why has Baboo come to the window? (He has probably followed the smell of Prince Dev.) Read the next section. Would the guards have believed who Prince Dev was without Baboo? (possibly not)

3

How do you think Mr Gold felt when he went through the streets? (humiliated, embarrassed) Why might the townspeople be pleased? (They knew Mr Gold and he might have bullied them when he had his magic ring.) Compare this scene with Mr Gold's entrance in chapter 1.

4

Why is Rocky worried that Dev will tell his grandmother about the diamond? (She would be disappointed in him.) Read to the end. How do Dev's parents feel? (surprised, delighted) Why do you think Dev says "We are friends, aren't we, Rocky?" (He probably hasn't had a friend before.)

5

What has made Prince Dev brave, clever and kind? (having the chance to do something for his father) Is his father right that it is dangerous outside? (Yes, but it is also good for Prince Dev.) Do you think Dev's life will be better with a friend? (He might feel less trapped and angry.)

6

Do you think Rocky will let him be a 'pampered prince' in the future? (probably not) Will Prince Dev manage to persuade his father that it is good to go outside the palace? What would you like to see happen in another adventure? (Perhaps they could swap places and play tricks in the palace.)


