Ask: Who is Aunt Agatha? (an alien) Ask: What do we know about Aunt Agatha? Together, locate details about Aunt Agatha in the text, for example: she is 400, she has 40 feet, 12 eyes and three heads, she is covered in scales, she used to be a head teacher, but she has now retired, she is from Saturn. If possible, look at a map of the solar system and find Saturn, Earth and the asteroid belt. 2

Ask: What has happened to poor Uncle Flint? (He has been squashed by some space rock.) Speculate what Uncle Flint is like that it might have been possible to blow him back up again. Agree that these aliens are very different from us. Ask: How does Uncle Flint's death help Aunt Agatha? (He leaves her lots of money.) Ask: What does she decide to do with the money? (Become an explorer like cousin Blaze.) Ask: What does Galactic mean? Where might you spend Galactic pounds?

What is Aunt Agatha's spaceship like? Read the paragraph starting 'My spaceship is in a terrible state...' and agree that it sounds like it's about to fall apart. Spend time speculating on what it might look like, allowing the children to use their imagination. Challenge the children to locate three adjectives in this paragraph. (terrible, ghastly and best). Discuss the meaning of ghastly. Continue the hunt in the next paragraph, locating noisy, smelly and angry.

Ask: How is this story written? Agree that it is an email. Together, find the features of a letter. Locate the salutation 'Dear Nephew'. Together, speculate on what the Nephew's reply might be. Model starting the email 'Dear Aunt Agatha' and encourage the children to comment on the events described in the email and answer Aunt Agatha's question at the end. Encourage them to explain their decision at the end, for example 'You should help the police officer because then they will trust you.' Ask: What happens when Aunt Agatha arrives on Earth? Encourage the children to take turns to retell part of the story. For example: Aunt Agatha lands in a car park, crushing some of the cars. She has an argument with a man then frightens all the humans when she comes out of her spaceship. A boy and a girl seem pleased to see her. Aunt Agatha sees a police officer chasing a man. Ask: What do you think Martian spider pigs might be like? (Animals with wild waving arms.)

Ask: What is Aunt Agatha like? Help the children to make judgements using Aunt Agatha's actions – she lands on cars, she doesn't seem to feel sorry for squashing cars, she thinks the humans are silly. Agree that she is funny and a bit thoughtless. Find the phrase "You can't park that horrible thing at a shopping centre!" Ask: Who has appalling manners: the man or Aunt Agatha? Ask the children to suggest other problems Aunt Agatha could cause on Earth.



# Go with the children

The children are smiling at Aunt Agatha and do not seem to be afraid of her, so this could be a good way for her to get to know the humans. We know she is used to talking to children from being a head teacher, although she does seem disgusted by the human children and their smiles!

# Help the police officer catch the man

We do not yet know whether Aunt Agatha has any special powers or equipment that would let her help the police officer. Perhaps she is just very quick because of all her feet! Do you think this choice might help her if she can show the police officer that she is not dangerous?

# Get back in your spaceship. This dreadful planet is not worth it!

Aunt Agatha is trying to be an explorer. Should she give up straight away before she has had a look around planet Earth? Remember, her batteries need recharging anyway, so it is likely that she will need to stay on the planet for a little while, whatever she decides to do!

# **Discussion Activity**


