

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Remember the drama at the end of chapter 2: Rocky has stolen the diamond; everyone in the palace is in a trance. Read to the first break. What is Mr Gold's new plan? (to keep Prince Dev prisoner until his parents pay a ransom) Do you think Mr Gold will leave after that? (probably not) How is Dev transformed? Find these verbs: grabbed, ripped, tore, flew off. Find vocabulary that shows that Baboo is large and powerful compared to the red jewel. (*lumbered*, *planted*, *heavy*, *crushed*) What do the words gasped, *knelt* and *scooped* tell us? (Mr Gold is shocked and desperate.)

Find the phrase "Don't you try and hypnotise me!" Why is the word me in italics? What does it tell us? (to read me with added emphasis; that Dev thinks it is one thing to hypnotise the guards and his parents but outrageous that Mr Gold should hypnotise him) Read to the next break. What would have happened if the guards had woken up before the fight? (They would have known that Dev was the prince.) Read to the end. Why is Dev amazed by the crowds? (He has never been outside on his own before; crowds would have been kept away from him when he went out.)

What sights, sounds and smells might Prince Dev experience? (shouting, animals, food, poor people) How do we know that Prince Dev is cross, rather than upset, when the girl doesn't believe who he is? (*shouted*, *stamped*) Do you remember the tantrum he had at the beginning of chapter 1?

How does Prince Dev know where to find Rocky? (The girl says that his 'palace' has a red door.) What does Dev notice as he runs? (The area is very poor.) What do you think will happen in chapter 4? Will Dev get the diamond back? Will he find Rocky? Will Rocky pretend to be the prince?





3 How should the sentence "Don't you try and hypnotise <i>me</i> !" be read?				










Inspire words

Find these words in the story. Look at how they are used. Cut up the words and put them in a bag. Make up a sentence for each word.










Character profiles

Reading comprehension (pp. 4-5)

For example:

1. He is going to say that he will keep Prince Dev prisoner until they give him money.
