Draw a postcard and then write it to somebody, telling them all about what you can see and do at the beach.</p>	<p>Choose a seaside resort (that you have been to if possible) and research how it has changed over time. There will probably be lots of old photos online as well as modern ones. Present what you have found out in anyway that you choose.</p>
<p>Choose a seaside town. Create a poster to encourage people to visit the town.</p>	<p>Choose a coastal area in a different country. Compare it with a coastal area in Great Britain. List the similarities and differences between the two. Where would you prefer to go on holiday? Why?</p>	<p>Find out about how humans are impacting on our seas and coastal areas. You could investigate things such as plastic pollution. How could we make things better?</p>
