Text Questions

Chapter 5: The Ugly Truth

- 1. What did the salesman look like? Did you guess who the salesman was right at the start of the chapter?
 - **TEACHER NOTE:** He wore a black-and-white-striped suit two sizes too big, and a giant bowler hat. Beneath that, his straggly hair, purple warts and pointed teeth looked a bit familiar.
- 2. What sort of transport is the salesman selling? What does 'Only one previous careful owner' mean? Why is this funny? Who do you think the previous owner was?
- 3. What does the prince say he has learnt from this quest? What does the salesman say in response to this?

 TEACHER NOTE: "If I've learnt anything from this quest, it's to stay away from magic!"

 "Then you're in luck, sir. This flying carpet isn't magic, but pure
 - science! To prove it, I'll let you have a trial run, free of charge."
- 4. What happened when the prince and Harold sat on the magic carpet? Was it really a flying carpet? Was there anything magic about it?
- 5. What three verbs beginning with 's' does the author use to describe the carpet's movement down the hill? Go back to the text to find out.

 TEACHER NOTE: slipped, slid, slithered
- 6. Why does Prince Charming tell Harold to 'hang on'? What happens next?



- 7. They crash through the roof of a shoe shop. How does the shopkeeper react to this? Did you find this amusing?
- 8. What happens when Prince Charming knocks on the door of Cinderella's house?
- 9. "I'm Charlotte, Cinderella's stepsister," said the girl.
 "Oh right, one of the ugly sis—," Prince Charming clapped a hand to his mouth.
 Why does the prince clap his hand over his mouth? What was he about to say? How does Charlotte feel about this?
- 10. What does the prince enjoy doing, much to his surprise?
- 11. How does Cinderella react when she sees the white shoebox wrapped with a pretty pink bow? How does she react when she sees the glass slippers inside? Were you surprised by this?
- 12. What terrible joke does Charlotte make? Why is the word 'slip' funny?
- 13. In chapter 3, the 'wicked' witch said that her magic mirror would show Prince Charming his true love. Was she right? Were you surprised by this?
- 14. How does the story end? Did you like the ending? Have you enjoyed reading this 'twisted' fairytale?



Writing Activities

Can you imagine what Prince Charming and Charlotte's wedding would be like? Write down some ideas. Then write a few lines that could be added to the story to describe the wedding.

How do we know that Charlotte is a kind person? Find two examples in chapter 5 that show this. Write a few sentences about each to explain why Charlotte is kind.

Do you think that the 'wicked' witch might perform at Prince
Charming and Charlotte's wedding? Write a wedding rap for the
witch to perform. You might like to write down a list of rhyming words
before you start.



Other Extension Activities

Art Activity

Draw your favourite scene from the final chapter of Prince Charming and his Quest for a Wife. Write two or three sentences to explain why this is your favourite part.

Make a collage picture showing Prince Charming and Charlotte's wedding. Think carefully about the colours and textures that you want to use in your picture. Make it as bright and eye-catching as you can.

Design a cover for Prince Charming and his Quest for a Wife.

Remember to put the author's name on the cover. Write a blurb for the back cover that will make other children want to read it. **TEACHER NOTE:** template provided.

Discussion Activities

The final chapter is called 'The Ugly Truth'. Why do you think the author chose this title? Do you think that it is a good title for the chapter?



Do you think that Prince Charming chose the right girl to marry? Do you think he would have been happy if he had married Cinderella, or one of the other characters he met in the story? Do you think he will be happy with Charlotte?

steep - having a sharp slope


trickster - someone who likes to play tricks on people
