

Locate the description of the shop being 'squeezed' and discuss the impression this makes. A shop can't be squeezed but the use of this word makes it sound as if it is narrow and that the other two shops overwhelm it – making it look small and insignificant. 2

Look at what makes the story funny and not scary. Although the shop is full of scary things - spend time locating the traditional ghost story setting elements such as real ghosts, skeletons and eyeballs – no one is scared of them because they think everything is fake. No one is frightened and no one is in danger. The ghosts seem rather sad and sweet. The humour comes out of the mismatch between the ghosts' ideas and thoughts and their customer's ideas and thoughts.

Consider the name 'Mr Creep'. Discuss the meaning of the word 'creep' and 'creepy' – the words suggest moving or behaving in a secretive and underhand way. Discuss how this might be a good name for a ghost, but perhaps this ghost isn't so creepy, though he might like to be. Discuss the humour in a ghost having a mobile phone. Ask: What sort of things might we expect a ghost to have – maybe a fountain pen and old-fashioned paper?

Help the children to understand that people think the items for sale are too strange and they don't understand them. Ask: Do you think people would be more likely to buy the items if they knew that Cedric and Mr Creep were real ghosts and the items were real? Do you think they should pretend that the items are fake? Do you think that the shop should be cleaned up or left covered in cobwebs? If you owned the shop how would you make people buy the items inside?


Discuss what the children might buy from this shop. Use this opportunity to draw the children back to the details in the text and to engage with the setting. Encourage them to use their imaginations to describe other items that might be for sale in the Little Shop of Ghosts.


