Restrictions do not persist once removed, thus all previous restrictions no longer apply. "Our priority is for you to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils." 	MUSICAL GROUPS.	Shared instruments (Rock and Pop, microphones, percussion, keyboards) will need to be cleaned appropriately and these musicians should be given wipes and instructions on how often to clean equipment. Records of attendance and reasons for absence will be maintained by conductors in order to spot and manage potential outbreaks.

Where the Music Service is advised of a school where a teacher is at potential risk of infection through outbreak, we will advise that they take a PCR test and isolate pending the result.

Teachers have been trained on managing their own personal data in relation to telephone numbers and e mail addresses.	L
Irritant Contact Dermatitis	Music service staff Exposure through excessive hand washing.	 Employees reminded to report signs of dermatitis to their manager i.e. itchy, dry or red skin. Advised to dry hands thoroughly after washing them and, if necessary, moisturise your hands to replenish the skin's natural oils. 	L

		Employees are asked to wash their hands with soap and water if possible. If only alcohol- based hand sanitizers are available, to make sure all liquid is evaporated before touching any surfaces.	
Ignition of alcohol-based hand sanitizer	Employees Burns to the hands as a result of ignition of sanitizer vapour (particularly employees who smoke)	 Ensure santiser is stored away from any source of ignition. Please be mindful of portable heaters and other heaters as we approach the winter. It is recommended that the portable bottles of 100ml santiser are used for work in schools. These are provided by the music service. 	L
