### What do Governors do?

Governors provide strategic leadership and accountability in our school. We hold the main responsibility for finance in school and work alongside the Executive Headteacher to make decisions about budgeting. Governors work with the schools to set the strategic direction, aims and objectives, and to monitor and evaluate the progress the school is making towards achieving them. We appoint, support and challenge the senior leaders and have an important role in ensuring that all stakeholders in the schools have a voice.

## New Governor Profiles

My last position was at a large infant school of seven classes plus a nursery. I was a class teacher and as Literacy subject leader was part of the management team. Our last inspection before I retired was in 2014 obtaining outstanding in all areas.

## Training

Staff and Governors alike are provided with a wide variety of regular training sessions to support continuing professional development and school improvement activities. New Governors receive an Induction and New Governor Training including Safeguarding and Prevent as well as any topics relevant to their Link roles and/or committee membership eg Finance.

During and since the lockdowns, our meetings and training has all been carried out on line, which has necessitated achieving a level of proficiency in video conferencing with Microsoft Teams. We are due an Ofsted review at Bomere Heath during the this academic year (delayed from last year due to the pandemic) and all Governors have received Ofsted Inspection training in preparation for the next inspection.

## Class Structure

Bomere Heath will remain at 5 classes and Ruyton will increase to 4 classes plus nursery in September based on current roll numbers.

## School Improvements

This year we completed the new library and changes to the layout of Wrekin classroom to allow more space at Bomere Heath. We were delighted to be able to install a new trim trail at Bomere Heath, thanks to the generosity of the Friends, parents and local businesses
